- Human trafficking is the third fastest growing crime in the world. The ILO estimates human traffickers are earning \$150 billion a year from it.

- The public is being educated on what human trafficking is and how to report it to the police, and they will be contacting your department.

- It will raise the likelihood that the crime will be discovered, and help you achieve a successful prosecution of perpetrators.
- It will prevent embarrassment to your department when you fail to have a program in place to rescue victims or arrest perpetrators.
